## **SECTION B**

41. Lay the shirt with back facing up on a clean flat surface

Make a fold through middle of right bodice

And bring the side seam to lie on centre back

Turn sleeve to bring the sleeve crease in line with the fold

Make a fold through middle of left bodice

Bring the side seam on the left to lie on centre back

Turn sleeve on the left to bring the sleeve crease in line with the left fold.

Fold through middle to bring the hem level with edge of collar and keep in bag

Each point  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 8 = 4 marks

b) Shake to remove loose dirt

Wash quickly in warm soapy water

Use gentle friction and mild detergent

Rinse thoroughly and quickly in clean warm water to remove detergent

Final rinse in cold water to which salt has been added to fix colour

Dry flat in a shade after squeeze out most water

c) Neglected brass trophy

Cover the surface with old newspapers for protection

for free papers visit www.freekcsepastpapers.com Dust inside and out to remove loose dirt

Shake the brasso tin thoroughly to mix well

By use of a polishing rug, apply brasso spa<u>ring</u>ly on the trophy inside and outside Leave for a few minutes to absorb/react

With another clean rug, rub the surface until brasso is removed.

Fold the rug into a pad and use cleaner side to make trophy shine

42. a) Cut the waistband on a straight grain according to pattern

The width should be twice the size of the finished waist band plus seam allowance on both sides

The length should be the size of the waist band before its finished plus an extension for fastening

Cut the interfacing that is equal to the finished width and length of the waist band Attach the interfacing onto the WS

The stiffening should cover the seam allowance With the RS together tack or baste the waist band and machine stitch both ends Trim the turnings and cut off diagonally at the pointed ends
Trim and snip where necessary
Turn the waistband onto the RS and press along the fold line
Complete the skirt/trouser seams and opening

- 43. a) Preparation of a set in short sleeve
  - (i) Make two rows of gathering stitches between the notches on either side of the 6mm from fitting line, leave threads hanging.

- (ii) Make the under arm seam, neaten and press flat
- (iii) Draw up the tacking threads in readiness for attaching the sleeves fasten the loose threads on a pin.

- The French seam has two rows of permanent stitches
  The seam allowances are enclosed and there is no chance of fraying
  With wrong side of fabric together and edges even, pin and lack 6mm above the
  fitting line (1 mark)
  Remove pins and machine stitch along tacking (1 mark)
  Remove tacking and trim off the raw edges to within 3-4mm
  Press the seam open. Press on both sides (½ mark)
  Turn work such that the right sides are facing and knife-edge with RS together, pin
  and tack along the fitting line enclosing the raw edges completely (1 mark)
  Remove tackings and press the seam fell towards the back of the garment (½ mark)
