Write an essay supporting the statement, "To be successful in life, you must be determined enough to face and overcome the challenges that come your way." Illustrate your answer with particular references to Grusha's experience in the play, "The Caucasian Chalk Circle," by Bertolt Brecht.

3. THE OPTIONAL SET TEXTS.

Answer any one of the following questions.

Either

(a) The Short Story.

Longhorn (pub) When the Sun Goes Down; and Other Stories from Africa and Beyond.

Write an essay supporting the proposition, "Oppression trains the oppressed to become oppressors," citing relevant illustrations from Rayda Jacobs short story entitled "The Guilt."

Or

(b) Drama

Francis Imbuga: Betrayal in The City.

With close reference to Francis Imbuga's "Betrayal in The City." Validate the proposition that, "Dictatorship as a style of leadership breeds a lot of evil in the society."

Or

(c) The Novel

WitiIhimaera, The Whale Rider

"Male chauvinism has blinded many men from seeing the enormous ability in women." With close reference to the events in WitiIhimaera's novel, "The Whale Rider" support this statement.
