- 3. Advertising costs for Sh.12,900 was still due as at 30 April 2019.
- 4. A further amount of Sh.13,000 are to be written off as bad debts.
- 5. Allowance for bad debts for the year is to be increased by Sh.10,350.
- 6. Depreciation on fixed assets is to be provided for as follows:

Motor vehicles 20% on reducing balance.

The following errors were later discovered and when corrected, the suspense account was eliminated:

- 1. Purchases day book was overcast by Sh.3,000.
- 2. A credit note for Sh.27,000 received from J. Mutio was not recorded anywhere in the books.
- 3. Interest received from the bank of Sh.1,000 was recorded on the credit side of the cash book but correctly recorded in the general ledger.
- 4. An invoice for Sh.58,900 received from Naitore Wholesalers was credited to their personal account as Sh.59,800.
- 5. A cheque for Sh.15,000 issued to M. Machage was correctly recorded in the cash book but posted to the wrong side of his personal account.
- 6. Sales day book was undercast by Sh.10,000.
- 7. An invoice of Sh.23,000 issued to Z. Kadija was recorded on the wrong side of the affected accounts.
