- He opened the book/ found the place that was written about him/ read it to the people
- After reading he closed the book and gave it to the attendants/ sat down.

- He told them that the scripture he had read was fulfilled in their hearing.
- All the people were happy with what he had spoken.
- People wondered aloud saying "Is this not Joseph's son?"
- Jesus told them that they would ask him to do in his own country things he had dome in Capernaum/ a prophet is not accepted in his own country.
- He told them that there were many widows in Israel during the time of Elijah but God sent the prophet to a widow in Zarephath.
- Jesus passed through their midst and went away.
- They were filled with anger/ wanted to throw him headlong down the cliff.
- He challenged them to move from the old traditional order to the pew one which he had brought.
- The disciples of Jesus plucked and ate grains on the Sabbath day which was unlawful/ he had healed a man with a withered hand on the Sabbath day.
